If an applicant signed up to do cover crops for multiple years and decided not to do it for the full term specified in the maintenance/performance agreement, the landowner would be required to pay back the entire cost share amount. It is not prorated for the number of years the practice was used.

***Although the published seeding dates provide the best guidance for establishing cover crops, a late seeding variance for winter cereal rye, winter triticale, and camelina allows these species to be seeded prior to December 21.*

The late seeding date requires additional management considerations to realize the benefits of seeding a cover crop. Drilling or incorporating the seed in the late fall will improve establishment, allowing the cover crop to grow longer in the spring prior to termination will allow more biomass and root growth.
